On a beautiful weekend at the end of July more than twenty volunteers valiantly worked to clear the site of undergrowth and overgrown shrubs. We wish to express our thanks to John Kemp at HDC and FCC Environment who removed all the waste and Ben Copson, a local arborist, for tidying up some of the trees and Roger for removing the waste Ben produced. All free of charge.

We can now see our Village Hall again but we will need to remove the large stumps that remain. If anyone is willing and able to give it a go please get in touch with Tessa or any of the other councillors.

On the right hand side of the drive is the site earmarked for Alice's garden. Children from Church Langton Primary School with the support of RHS are in the process of developing a design which will be executed as soon as the site is fully prepared and ready for planting. However on the morning of Friday 3rd November it is hoped that a group of children will start the process by planting bulbs. Volunteers are very welcome to join us. Plans for the hall refurbishment are almost complete and will be shared with the village very soon. Wheelie Bins

It is an offence to leave your Wheelie Bin out on the public highway or other public area – please ensure all bins are returned to your property once empty.

If Wheelie Bins are found to be left out in a public area Harborough District Council will write to the person responsible asking for the bins to be removed. If this is not successful they will send a second letter asking for immediate removal. Following this second letter if the bin is still not removed Harborough District Council will remove them and charge for re-delivery.

Historic Churches Ride

Seven cyclists from Tur Langton and one from Virginia, USA took part in a sponsored bike ride on 9th September organised by the Historic Churches Trust.

The cyclists covered a 14 mile route and visited ten churches as far away as Medbourne and Ashley. This was a particular achievement for two of our younger riders, Benedict Briggs and Tyler Morris, both aged six.

Kier Siemens, on behalf of National Grid, will start improvement work to the Gas Distribution Offtake Station and Above Ground Installation (AGI) site on Mere Road on 16 October 2017. The work should be complete by July 2018.
