



Cops On Parks (COPS)

Over the past month the neighbourhood officers have been deployed in topical locations that we know have suffered anti-social behaviour historically and currently. Most of these deployments have been within Market Harborough and Kibworth and we have worked under the banner of 'Cops On Parks' (COPS).

The idea of this is that the event is advertised on social media prior to the event to allow those who are affected by the issues to attend and speak to both the Police and the Council who attend.

On the whole this has been well received and has provided an important link to the services that can look to fix and resolve the issues. It has also resulted in ASB in the locations being low and all concerned have taken the opportunity to speak to the youths and understand their view point, but also stress the biggest issues which is smashing of glass, litter and noise – which they understand.

Harborough District Council community safety partnership have also provided some funding to allow the Policing team to focus social media videos at target audiences to look to educate and reduce the problems.




Concerns over playing on railway lines

Last week we had a concerning report made to us where teenage girls had been witnessed on the railway line playing 'chicken' with the train. These trains are moving at great speed and roughly every 20 minutes.

The issue was highlighted on social media as it was felt this was our best response to address the issue. This was well received and resulted in some of the girls being identified and British Transport Police have ensured the girls have been visited and educated.

If you take one thing away from reading this newsletter, please speak to your children about the dangers of playing on a railway line and the very genuine threat to life.

Working at a police station with the mainline railway operating nearby we have all sadly seen deaths linked to trains—something we would not wish on anybody.

Before you go:

- Make sure your home is fully secure including any sheds, garages and outbuildings
- Don't forget to turn off dangerous electrical items such as the iron, hair straighteners, phone chargers etc.
- If possible, set lights on timers for different times and different rooms in the house to give the impression the house is not empty

Travelling to and from your destination:

- If you are driving make sure your car is roadworthy. That includes some basic checks of tyres, lights, oil and water
- Traffic jams are back. Pack some drinks and snacks just in case the journey is longer than expected
- If it is a long journey and you feel tired, stop at the nearest service area and take a break

When you are there:

- If you are out in the sun make sure you wear sun cream and a hat...sunstroke is no fun!
- When on the beach make sure you know the tide times and understand the flags that are flying
- Don't get complacent with your belongings... thieves still operate by the seaside
