HRH Platinum Jubilee Commemoration

June 2nd to 5th is the weekend of the
Queen's Jubilee. Plans so far are for a
tree planting ceremony on Thursday 2nd
June, Picnic at the village Hall on Friday
3rd and The Crown will be putting on an
event on Saturday 4th.

Tree Planting

To commemorate this event, in the
southern green area, at the junction of
Shangton Road and Main Street, a tree
will be planted. The area is part of
Highways land, so the council have
approached Highways for approval. Due
to the existing infrastructure and size of
this area, the council believes it would be
preferable to have a smaller variety of
tree able to achieve full maturity, than the
original proposed oak tree. The council
are researching native long-lived small
tree varieties that can be planted.

Picnic

The Village Hall Committee are
organising a picnic at the Village Hall
on Friday of the Jubilee weekend. If you
would like to get involved, the preliminary
kick-off meeting is 6.30pm 28th April at
the hall.

Highway Funding

The parish council have applied and
been given a £5000.00 grant for Highway
Improvement Projects, from
Leicestershire County Council. This
money will be used for the purchase of
Mobile Vehicle activated signs that we
can locate around the village at speeding
hotspots.

Dog Fouling Update

Tur Langton has been added to the
Harborough District Council
environmental crime officer's patrol
routes. It appears most walkers are from
outside the village but they will continue
to monitor to check for any incidents of
owners not picking up after their dogs.
Please note that dog faeces may carry

parasites that can cause incurable
deadly disease in both cattle and sheep.

Police Updates

There has been a significant rise in
Catalytic Converter Thefts. Typically hit
cars are hybrid models such as Toyota
Prius, Auris, Honda Accord and Jazz.
The whole theft can be done in as little
as 60 seconds with a mechanics creeper
to slide under the cars and can happen
anytime day or night. The thefts
typically occur in supermarket Car parks,
as well as on driveways, street parking.
Advice on protecting yourself includes
parking your car in a garage or
somewhere that makes it difficult to
access underneath, such as near a wall.
Installing CCTV that covers your car.
You can also have a marking kit fitted
for free as part of your next MOT. For more

Stepping into Spring (with your best shoes on!)



Osteopaths care about all of you, from the top of your head to the tips of your toes. It's almost time to pop those trusty winter boots away and step into lighter footwear - thank goodness!

It can be really tempting to go for less supportive footwear, however this is often not the best environment for our feet – especially if feet are sore/arthritis/suffering from an injury.

Emily always looks at her patient's shoes – it tells her so much about them biomechanically. She can get an insight into how they walk, weight-bear and if they weight-bear equally through their legs. You can tell a lot from looking at your shoes and checking if one shoe is more worn than the other, as well as if the shoe is right for them, for example is the shoe fitting correctly.

What all feet have in common is that they are an incredible biomechanical structure; they have 26 bones, lots of ligaments, and they take the weight of the body all day as well as absorbing ground force as we move. So, with this in mind it is only fair that we give our feet a good environment to work in. Wearing the 'wrong shoe' or unsupportive shoes can lead to a host of problems throughout the body. Ranging from foot pain and knee pain, to lower back pain, muscles in the legs getting tight and sore, the consequences can be far reaching.

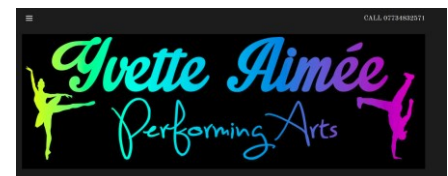
