Village Calming Speed Signs

Thank you to all the responses on the Traffic Calming received. Further to these comments, the Parish Council purchased two Speed Indicator Devices to replace the existing ones installed by Leicestershire County Council in 2008. We were able to purchase these two units with the help of the Leicestershire County Council Members Highway Fund Grant of £5000.

Both these units now allow us to record and collect data on the number and speed of vehicles driving through the village.

County News

There are various local consultations currently that will/may impact the village, so we would like to make you aware of them. Please, do look at them and give your opinion!

Leicestershire County Council Draft Budget Plans 2024-2028

Leicestershire County Council have published their 2024-2028 spending plans for consultation. These plans assume a proposed three per cent increase on core Council Tax for 2024/25 and incorporate an additional two per cent 'social care precept' increase. Increases of five per cent for 2025/26 and three per cent for 2026/27 and 2027/28 have been assumed. Decisions on future years' Council Tax levels, including the adult social care precept, will be taken prior to the start of each year.

Leicestershire County Council are not in crisis territory – but they do have a significant budget gap. Their four-year draft budget, known as the medium term financial strategy, shows that they have a gap of £12m next year for which they will





have to dip into reserves. This gap rises to £85m by 2028, and that is after plans for a further £77m of savings.

Waste Facilities Consultation

Growing demand for county council services and general price rises (inflation) are increasing the cost of delivering services. Leicestershire County council's budget plan includes a requirement to make savings from the recycling and household waste sites (often referred to as the 'tips'). The proposals below would make savings of £420,000 per year and have been designed to reduce costs whilst minimising the impact on residents and site users as far as possible.

The proposals include:

- Closing Market Harborough, Shepshed and Somerby recycling and household waste sites
- Changing the opening days at Bottesford and Melton Mowbray recycling and household waste sites
- Changing summer opening hours at all recycling and household waste sites
- Closing on Christmas Eve at all recycling and household waste sites
