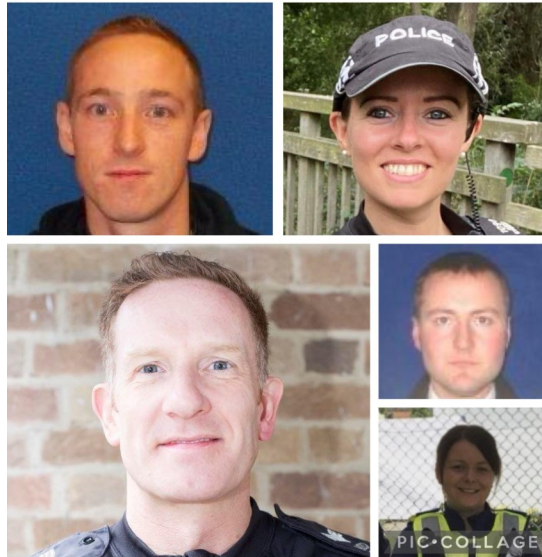

Can you help? Officers are appealing for information following a burglary in Billesdon. In the early hours of Friday (12 April), an address was broken into and the keys to a Blue BMW M2 were taken. The BMW was then stolen from outside the address. The car was later found abandoned in Grosvenor Gate, Leicester. Two golf trophies – pictured – were in the car when it was taken but had been removed when it was found. Detective Constable Matt Swift, the investigating officer, said: “I’m particularly keen to speak to anyone with information about this incident. “I’m hoping someone recognises the trophies and has either seen them listed or offered for sale.
