What have we done

- Speeding - checks between 01/05/2024 and 31/05/24.
 - A47, Two visits to the A6003, ten visits to the B6047
- Identifying and targeting the individuals causing the anti social behaviour. Passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach.
- Increasing patrols in areas where anti social behaviour is being reported to us.

Between May and August, we receive more reports of thefts from gardens. Here are some very simple steps to secure your property.

- A gravel path will make it impossible for a thief to approach without making a noise.
- Make sure all fences and gates are in good repair and the gate is locked with a heavy weight padlock or alarmed padlock.
- Make sure that all items are put inside a secure shed or garage .
- Prickly hedges can act as an barrier and deter even the most determined thief.
- Motion sensor lights are a great deterrent, as thieves like to work in the darkness.
- Make sure that any rotten or damaged wood is replaced.
- Secure doors with an alarm or an alarmed padlock and tamper proof door plates.
- Use adhesive film on the inside of windows to prevent anyone seeing what is inside and fit key operated window locks.
- Never leave your tools and equipment out overnight.
- Ensure that your household insurance policy covers thefts from your shed, garage and garden.
- Consider an alarm.
- Steel cables and a 2-bolt anchor can be fitted to garage walls and passed through pedal cycles and motorbikes.
