What have we done

- Wednesday 8th November, Harborough area received some extra police attention as they were joined by Driver & Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA) and Leicestershire Police traffic officers.
- Identifying and targeting the individuals causing the anti social behaviour. Passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach.
- Raising awareness of technology to prevent vehicle theft, such as Faraday bags.
- Increasing patrols in areas where vehicle theft is higher and using automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) to stop suspicious vehicles.

Wednesday 8th November, Harborough and Lutterworth Police area received some extra police attention as they were joined by Driver & Vehicle Standards Agency (DVSA) and Leicestershire Police traffic officers. The focus was anything that stood out for.

Thirty-four vehicles in total were stopped for further checks. Of those, the DVSA issued a total of 21 prohibitions. (Some of these are serious which means that cannot leave site until repaired). Prohibitions included being overweight, tyres in poor condition, missing trailer reg plates and other more serious and critical faults.

One driver had no tax or MOT for 2 years. One had a vehicle that had recently failed an MOT but was continuing to drive it. Three vehicles were recovered by police for having no tax or insurance.



Also, this month was the Remembrance Day parade in many of the villages on our area. We attended as many parades and laid wreaths at as many memorials as we could.
